Karen Talbott called the meeting to order at 10:13AM. Ms. Talbott indicated that this was special meeting specifically intended to review and recommend approval of the the levy request to Summit County Council.

Elizabeth Bartz gave the Budget & Levy report. Ms. Bartz gave a recap of the earlier presentation from Summit DD Superintendent John Trunk. Some key highlights included:

- The DD levy request is not a new tax, it is a renewal
- "No waiting lists"
- Focus on meeting the needs of growing demand and that all in the board system have opportunity to have a good quality of life
- Since DD is transitioning out of direct service (fully transitioned out by 2019), there will be an
  increased focus on quality assurance, connecting individuals with individualized plans and
  resources
- Anticipating growth among young children (0-6), where Summit DD will remain a direct service provider
- Growth in outreach to schools to help develop life skills for successful transition to adulthood
- Fund balance will continue to decrease as DD will lose revenue over the next levy cycle
- DD has taken steps to assist staff in transition out of direct service through providing some resources (website, resume assistance, job postings etc.)
  - Some staff have started their own businesses due to the expansion of provider opportunities
  - Some are getting jobs with other providers who will now have a need to grow capacity
  - Many are eligible for retirement
  - o Once DD has transitioned, they will require 250-270 staff for operations

There was a motion to recommend Summit County DD Levy request to Summit County Council by Malcolm Costa. All approved by voice vote.

There was no other business brought forward.
